Stage 1 - Mild Rationing

A drought contingency plan for Red Oak Subdivision sets water conservation measures in stages based on daily demand and output capacity. Beginning, Friday, September 11, Red Oak Subdivision is returning to Stage 1 Mild Drought Contingency and is requiring citizens and businesses within the district limits to implement conservation measures by observing the following practices:

While conditions have improved enough to lessen the district's daily demand and output capacity, we continue to encourage residents and businesses to implement voluntary conservation practices.

We ask that our community consider the following tips while we maintain Stage 1 Mild Drought Contingency:

- Limit washing outdoor facilities and driveways.
- Limit hand-washing vehicles.
- Limit refilling swimming pools.
- Limit refilling outside fountains or ponds for aesthetic purposes (this does not include any fountains or ponds supporting wildlife).
- Limit power washing and cleaning structures.
- For landscape watering, only water between 7:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m. on designated watering days. For even addresses (ending in 0, 2, 4, 6 or 8), water on Sundays and Thursdays. For odd addresses (ending in 1,3, 5, 7, or 9), water on Saturdays and Wednesdays.

We thank all residents who practice these simple water-saving actions to help us maintain a robust, dependable water supply system for ongoing local consumption.
